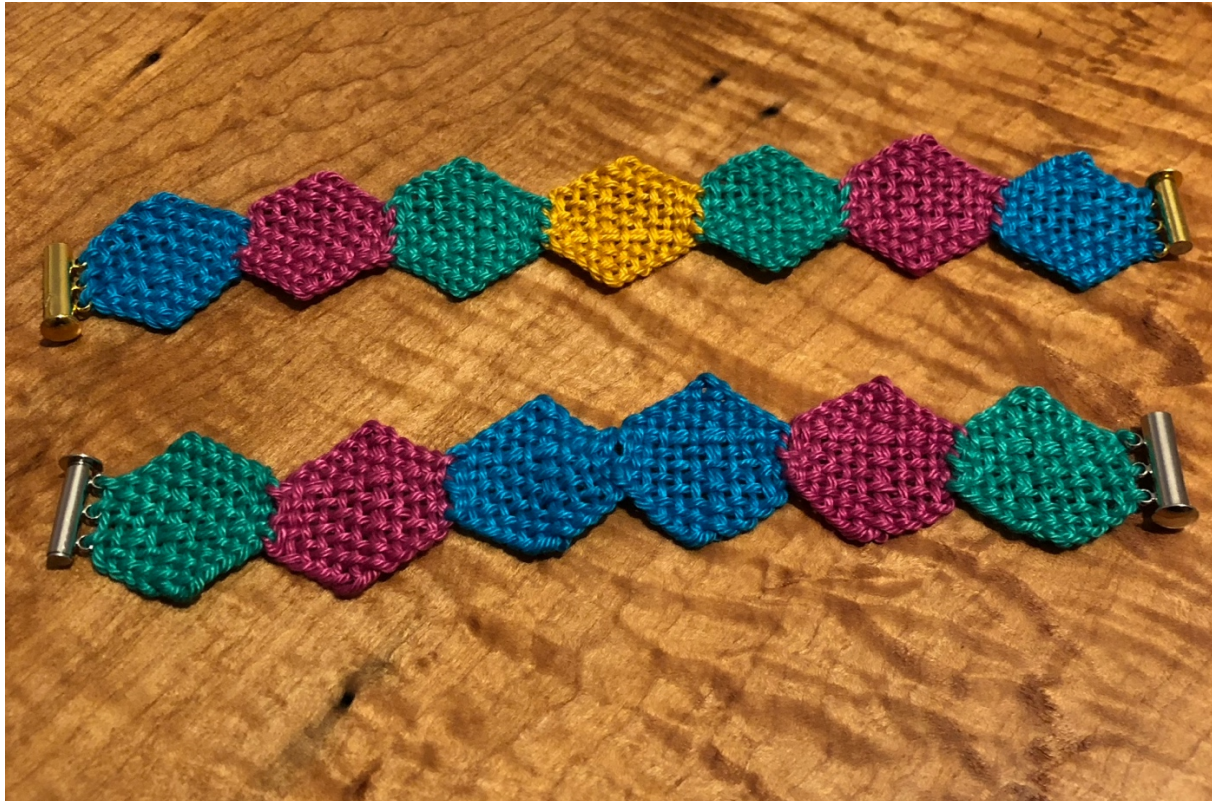


PennyTURTLE Hexagon Bracelet
Project by Greta Holmstrom

Weave a fashionable bracelet using the 1" PennyTURTLE Loom.



Equipment

1" PennyTURTLE Loom; 5" weaving needle; size C-2/2.75 mm crochet hook or a 2.75 mm locker hook, tapestry needle.

1 slide clasp with three ring strands – for example:

Yarn

Approximately 1 yard for each hexagon of sock yarn or other fingering weight yarn

Steps

1. Measure your wrist, or the wrist of your intended recipient. You will be weaving one hexagon for each wrist inch. If the measurement is at or above the half inch mark, upsize to the next inch.
2. Following the TURTLE Loom directions, weave the hexagons. As you are weaving, identify one hexagon for the left-hand side and one hexagon for the right-hand side. These will need to have the clasp sewn in. As you are weaving these hexagons horizontally, sew the yarn through each of

the eyes on the clasp against the side pins. As shown in the picture above, one clasp will be facing up, the other down.

3. Lay out the hexagons in a row in the order you would like for the bracelet. Orient the hexagons in the same directions. One clasp piece should be on the left and one on the right.
4. Whipstitch the sides of the hexagons together.
5. Weave-in the ends on all the hexagons and trim.
6. Enjoy!
